Main objective of today's meeting is to plan the 2009 annual meeting. Also, to transition between current and future ExCom.

Problem with OSU scholarship enrollment. Rebecca will write up a proposal for the validity and need of coordinated timing for scholarship announcements.

Start student-session at 6:30 and go until 8:00, and have heavy refreshments. Start poster session at 8:00.
