As human populations continue to grow, we can't overlook the cities and what must be done to minimize urban impacts to the rivers and streams flowing through them. Until recently, traditional restoration efforts have been concentrated on streams in less urbanized watersheds and their associated salmon populations.

The only way to begin answering these and other questions is to first understand what the impacts are and how salmon are currently using these areas. This symposium will begin looking at these and related questions.
